

## Attention Bodega Owners with Cats

We're glad you've decided to share your store with a cat! Your cat performs an important service in keeping away mice, rats and vermin. If you haven't already, there are a few things you can do to make sure he or she stays healthy and safe while doing the job!

- Most important, every cat should be **spayed** (for females) or **neutered** (for males). It's not true that cats get lazy or don't hunt if they're fixed! In fact, fixing your cat is a good thing:
  - Cats who are fixed roam and fight less. This means less danger that they will be run over, get hurt or catch diseases.
  - o Male cats stop spraying and smelling bad.
  - Female cats won't get pregnant better for them, better for you, and better for the city, which kills tens of thousands of unwanted animals every year.
- Your cats should have their basic **vaccinations** (rabies, distemper). Cats that go outside are especially likely to get these diseases.
- Your cat should **wear a safety collar and tag**. Even better, have him/her **microchipped** by a vet! Cats should always be tagged in case they get lost. Otherwise, they are likely to be sent to Animal Care and Control and killed.
